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# 1. Introduction

## 1.1. Purpose and Audience of this Guide

- 1 This document is intended for all Notification Platform (NP) users, as it is a comprehensive user manual describing the most frequent user needs, such as how to access and use the tool.

## 1.2. What is REMIT?

- 2 REMIT stands for Regulation (EU) No 1227/2011 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 25 October 2011 on wholesale energy market integrity and transparency. It was published in the Official Journal of the European Union on 8 December 2011 and entered into force 20 days following its publication, i.e. on 28 December 2011. On 7 May 2024, the revised Regulation on Wholesale Energy Market Integrity and Transparency (EU Regulation 2024/1106) entered into force. REMIT introduces, for the first time, a consistent EU-wide framework:

- a) defining market abuse, in the form of market manipulation, attempted market manipulation and insider trading, in wholesale energy markets;
- b) introducing the explicit prohibition of market manipulation, attempted market manipulation and insider trading in wholesale energy markets;
- c) establishing a new framework for the monitoring of wholesale energy markets to detect and deter market manipulation and insider trading; and
- d) providing the enforcement of the above prohibitions and the sanctioning of breaches of market abuse rules at national level.

## 1.3. REMIT and the Notification Platform

- 3 The Notification Platform allows any user to transmit information to National Regulatory Authorities (NRAs) and the Agency for the Cooperation of Energy Regulators (the Agency or ACER). It should be used by person professionally arranging or executing transactions (PPAETs) to fulfil their notification obligations under Article 15 of REMIT. It allows NRAs and Competent Financial Authorities (CFAs) to fulfil their notification obligation to the Agency under Article 16 of REMIT. Furthermore, it can be used by Market Participants (MPs), and other stakeholders to notify potential REMIT breaches.
- 4 The table below illustrates the types of notifications, the notifying parties and notified parties that can use the NP.

### 1.3.1. Notification to cover the immediate physical loss - Article 3(4)(b) of REMIT (for market participants)

5 Pursuant to Article 3(4)(b) of REMIT, the prohibitions of insider trading in Article 3 shall not apply to transactions entered into by electricity and natural gas producers, (...) the sole purpose of which is to cover the immediate physical loss resulting from unplanned outages, where not to do so would result in the market participant not being able to meet existing contractual obligations (...). In such a situation, the relevant information relating to the transactions shall be reported to the Agency and the NRA.

6 Concerning the exemption in Article 3(4)(b) of REMIT, the Agency considers that since the exemption is limited in scope to the market participants mentioned therein, any unplanned outage under the exemption of Article 3(4)(b) may only relate to production, storage or LNG import facilities. It furthermore considers that the exemption may only be applied for unplanned outages, i.e. outages which are not ex ante known by the primary owner of the data, and that any physical loss needs to be caused immediately and solely by that unplanned outage. The aforementioned market participants can only use this exemption to enter into transactions to cover the immediate physical loss. Any further trading that goes beyond covering the immediate (i.e. within the day) physical loss does not fall under the scope of this exemption.

7 In addition, the exemption in Article 3(4)(b) of REMIT may only be applied by the aforementioned market participants for transactions as described above in the following two instances:

- where not to do so would result in the market participant not being able to meet existing contractual obligations; or
- where such action is undertaken in agreement with the TSO(s) concerned to ensure a safe and secure operation of the system.

8 Regarding the first instance, the Agency considers that the referenced contractual obligations must exist ex ante of the immediate physical loss resulting from unplanned outages. The existing contractual obligations must relate to the relevant period of the unplanned outage. The Agency considers a market participant as 'not being able' to meet such existing contractual obligations only for situations that would lead to actual contractual breaches and only if the market participant has no other own assets available to fulfil the obligation. The application of exemption in Article 3(4)(b) of REMIT cannot coincide with the application of Article 4(2) of REMIT concerning delayed disclosure of inside information, as Article 4(2) requires that the market participant does not make decisions relating to trading in wholesale energy products based on the relevant inside information.

- 9 As regards the second instance of exemption in Article 3(4)(b) of REMIT, the Agency considers that the criterion *‘to ensure the safe and secure operation of the system’* may apply in cases when market participants are, following an agreement with the TSO, acting on their behalf so that TSOs can ensure the safe and secure operation of the system in line with their obligations laid down in Article 40(1)(d) and (e) of Directive (EU) 2019/944 and Article 13(1)(a) and (c) of Directive 2009/73/EC.
- 10 Under such circumstances, and in the same way as foreseen in Article 3(3) when TSOs are acting directly, the sole purpose of the market participant transactions must be to ensure the safe and secure operation of the system. As a result, this exemption should also only apply to market participants when they act on behalf of TSOs, under a specific agreement, and at the ancillary services markets, excluding all other wholesale energy markets.
- 11 Concerning the time frame allowed to be covered under the exemption in Article 3(4)(b), the Agency considers it valid for as long as a causal link between the outage and the amount to be covered under the strict exemptions is in place. Therefore, the Article 3(4)(b) exemption may only be applied for the duration of *‘the market participant not being able to meet existing contractual obligations or where such action is undertaken in agreement with the transmission system operator(s) concerned in order to ensure safe and secure operation of the system’*.
- 12 If a market participant uses the exemption in Article 3(4)(b), the relevant information on the transactions shall be reported to the Agency and to the NRA. This notification should take place as soon as possible, according to the market participant’s best capacity. The Notification Platform allows transactions aimed at covering the immediate physical loss under Article 3(4)(b) to be simultaneously notified to both the Agency and the relevant national regulatory authority or authorities.

### **1.3.2. Exceptional delayed disclosure notification - Article 4(2) of REMIT (for market participants)**

- 14 According to Article 4(2) of REMIT, a market participant may exceptionally delay the public disclosure of inside information. According to Article 4(2):

*“A market participant may under its own responsibility exceptionally delay the public disclosure of inside information so as not to prejudice its legitimate interests provided that such omission is not likely to mislead the public and provided that the market participant is able to ensure the confidentiality of that information and does not make decisions relating to trading in wholesale energy products based upon that information. In such a situation the market participant shall without delay provide that information, together with a justification for the delay of the public disclosure, to the Agency and the relevant national regulatory authority having regard to Article 8(5).”*

- 15 The decision to exceptionally delay the public disclosure of inside information in accordance with Article 4(2) is for market participants to make. It is not the role of the Agency or NRAs to pre-approve the application of Article 4(2) to a specific set of circumstances. In any instance where a market participant chooses to delay disclosure, it must ensure that such a delay is not likely to mislead the public, that it does not make trading decisions on that information and that the information remains confidential. As Article 4(2) requires that the market participant does not make trading decisions based on that inside information, the Agency underlines that the application of Article 4(2) cannot coincide with the application of Article 3(4)(b) of REMIT. Whether a market participant rightly or falsely applied Article 4(2) can only be determined ex-post. As soon as the legitimate interests cease to exist, the market participant must disclose the inside information in accordance with Article 4(1).
- 16 By submitting a notification pursuant to Article 3(4)(b) and 4(2) of REMIT via the NP, a market participant simultaneously notifies both the relevant NRA and the Agency.

17 Notification Platform also allows PPAETs and NRAs to inform the Agency, as required by the following Articles of REMIT.

### 1.3.3. Reporting Suspicious Transactions or Orders (STOR) - Article 15 of REMIT (for PPAETs)

19 *Pursuant to Article 15(1) of REMIT, any person professionally arranging transactions in wholesale energy products who reasonably suspects that an order to trade or a transaction, including any cancellation or modification thereof, whether placed on or outside an OMP, could breach Article 3, 4 or 5, shall notify the Agency and the relevant national regulatory authority without further delay and in any event no later than four weeks from the day on which that person becomes aware of the suspicious event.*


20 The obligation on PPAETs to notify potential breaches under Articles 15(1) and 15(2) of REMIT entails meeting two cumulative criteria:

- There must be a reasonable suspicion of a breach; and
- The notification shall be made without further delay and in any event no later than four weeks from the day on which that person becomes aware of the suspicious event.

21 The timeliness of the notification after the occurrence of a suspicious event is of crucial importance when it comes to collecting evidence. The sooner ACER and the NRA(s) are informed about the reasonable suspicion of the potential breach, the earlier they can collect evidence. ACER encourages PPAETs to also submit any relevant additional information which they may become aware of after they fulfil their notification obligations.

22 Once PPAETs detect an event that requires further scrutiny, for example through alerts, they should collect evidence and conduct the necessary analysis to further assess that event. This will enable the PPAETs to assess whether there are reasonable grounds to suspect a potential breach of REMIT and to produce a timely and relevant Article 15 of REMIT notification.

23 By submitting a Suspicious Transaction and Order Report (STOR) via the NP, a PPAET simultaneously notifies the relevant NRA(s) and the Agency about the suspicious event.

### 1.3.4. Other Suspicious Transaction Reports (for all stakeholders)

25 The Notification Platform includes a general option called "Others", which allows any stakeholder to report suspicious transactions or orders in wholesale energy markets. This functionality is intended to ensure that any individual or entity who observes potential breaches of REMIT, such as suspicious trading behaviours or failures in the disclosure of inside information, can submit a notification.

26 Notifications under this section may also be submitted anonymously, which encourages broader vigilance and promotes market integrity.

### 1.3.5. NRAs Inform the Agency of Potential REMIT Breaches - Article 16(2) of REMIT (for energy regulators)

27 According to Article 16(2) of REMIT, NRAs shall, without delay and in as specific a manner as possible, inform the Agency whenever they have reasonable grounds to suspect that acts in breach of REMIT are being, or have been, carried out either within their own Member State or in another.

28 NRAs have at their disposal a dedicated and secure communication channel for such cases, namely the **Case Management Tool (CMT)**. NRAs may also use the **Notification Platform (NP)** as an alternative or interim solution to fulfil their reporting obligations in a timely manner.

### 1.3.6. NRA Inform the Competent Financial Authorities and the Agency – Article 16(3)(a) of REMIT (for energy regulators)

29 *NRAs shall process reports of possible breaches of this Regulation without undue delay and, if possible, within one year of the date of receipt of those reports, and inform the competent financial authority of their Member State and the Agency where they have reasonable grounds to suspect that acts are being, or have been, carried out on wholesale energy markets which constitute market abuse within the meaning of Regulation (EU) No 596/2014 and which affect financial instruments subject to Article 2 of that Regulation; for those purposes, national regulatory authorities may establish appropriate forms of cooperation with the competent financial authority in their Member State.*

30 To clarify, if the suspicious behaviour concerns only one Member State, the NRA should inform the NCA of that Member State and ACER.

### 1.3.7. Notification by Competent Financial Authorities - Article 16(3)(c)

31 *The competent financial authority of a Member State shall inform ESMA and the Agency where it has reasonable grounds to suspect that acts in breach of Articles 3 and 5 are being, or have been, carried out on wholesale energy markets in another Member State.*

### 1.3.8. Reporting Suspected Competition Law Violations – Article 16(3)(d) of REMIT (for energy regulators)

32 *NRAs shall inform the national competition authority of their Member State, the Commission and the Agency where they have reasonable grounds to suspect that acts are being, or have been, carried out on wholesale energy market which are likely to constitute a breach of competition law.*

33 **Please note that by submitting a notification pursuant to Article 16(3)(a) and 16(3)(d) of REMIT via the NP, NRAs only inform the Agency. Any other notification obligations under these Articles should be fulfilled separately.**

## 2. Access to the tool

34 The Notification Platform is accessible via the following link:

35 The platform is **publicly available online** and can be accessed by any user. **No registration is required** to access the tool.


36 Users can simply open the link using a standard web browser to view and consult the information available on the platform.

## 3. Submitting a notification

38 On the welcome page of the Notification Platform, users are invited to select the type of notification they intend to submit. The platform will then guide them through the relevant sections depending on the selected notification type.

39 **TIP:** The sign  appears next to each field throughout the NP. Move your cursor over the sign to get additional information on the corresponding field, including the type of information that needs to be provided.

### 3.1. Notification according to Article 3(4)(b) of REMIT

40 To submit a new Notification according to Article 3(4)(b) of REMIT, you will need to provide mandatory (see [Figure 3](#)) information on<sup>1</sup>:

- a) Details of the notifying party (Name of Market participant);
- b) Contact person (Surname, Name, E-mail, Address, Phone/Fax);
- c) Type of market participant entering into transactions (according to the types listed in the Article 3(4)(b));
- d) Competent Authority (National Regulatory Authority);
- e) Identification of the inside information concerned (Name of the facility, Dates of the unplanned outage);
- f) Identification of the transactions concerned (Other Details).

41 Once you have completed the form, have read ACER's data protection privacy statement and agreed with the personal data processing activities related to the use of the NP, click on the **"Submit"** button

at the bottom right corner of your screen. Your notification will be sent and registered. Click on the “Cancel” button if you wish to discontinue your submission.



### 3.2. Notification according to Article 4(2) of REMIT

- 43 To submit a new Notification according to Article 4(2) of REMIT, you will need to provide mandatory (see [Figure 5](#)) information on:
- Details of notifying party (Name of the Market participant);
  - Contact person (Surname, Name, E-mail, Address, Phone/Fax);
  - Competent Authority (National Regulatory Authority);
  - Identification of the inside information concerned;
  - Publication (Justification for delayed publication).
- 44 The submission of this type of notification requires filling in all mandatory fields, reading ACER's data protection privacy statement, and agreeing with the personal data processing activities related to the use of the NP.

### 3.3. Suspicious Transaction and Order Report– (STOR)

45 Notifications according to Articles 15, 16 (2), 16 (3)(a), 16 (3)(c), 16 (3)(d) of REMIT and Other suspicious transaction and order report are grouped together under the heading “Suspicious Transaction and Order Report (STOR)”, which appears on the welcome page (see [Figure 2](#)). Click on “**Suspicious Transaction and Order Report (STOR)**” on the welcome page and fill in the fields “Notifying party” and “Type of Notification” on the following page in order to access the relevant notification form. Click on “**Next**” to proceed or “**Cancel**” to go back to the welcome page (see [Figure 6](#)).

46 If you wish to submit a STOR but it does not belong to any type of entity listed under “Notifying Party”, please select the value “Others”. You can also submit an anonymous notification under this selection ([Figure 8](#)).

47 The paragraphs below provide a detailed description of how to submit a notification. For explanatory purposes only, the explanation and the figures focus on notifications submitted under Article 15 of REMIT.

- 48 The following pages request information regarding the potential REMIT breach you are reporting, including: i) Basic information; ii) Notifying party details; iii) Parties involved in the potential breach; iv) Description of the potential breach; and finally, v) Attachments and submission.
- 49 Each page requires filling in all mandatory fields before proceeding to the next one. Mandatory fields are marked with an asterisk (\*) and bold text. Once you have filled in all mandatory fields, you can proceed by clicking “Next” at the bottom of the page. Should you wish to return to a section you have already filled in, click on the “Back” button (or “Cancel” button on the “Basic Information” page) on the left-hand side of the page (see [Figure 7](#)).
- 50 Under the basic information heading you will be required to fill in information regarding the category of a potential REMIT breach, Potential MAR breaches (if you select “Art. 3” or “Art. 4”), the responsible NRA (the NRA to which you wish to report), and Commodity (see [Figure 7](#)). Once you fill in the fields, click on “Next” to proceed.

53 Once you have filled in your details, you can proceed to the next page by clicking “**Next**” at the bottom of the page.

### 3.3.2. Parties involved in the potential breach

54 This page requires information on the parties involved in the potential REMIT breach. You can choose a market participant involved in the potential REMIT breach by searching in the Centralised European Register of Energy Market Participants (CEREMP).

55 In order to use the search function in CEREMP, click on the “Search” button next to the field “Name of the legal/natural person(s) involved in the potential breach” or “Code of the legal/natural person(s) involved in the potential breach” (see [Figure 10](#)). After you click on “**Search**”, a pop-up window appears, showing you the list of available MPs.

- 56 The window allows you to search for a Market Participant by Name or by ACER code (see [Figure 11](#)). To perform a search, type the relevant information into the appropriate fields provided on top of the page and click “**Search**”, partial inputs are allowed. If the search results contain the item(s) you were searching for, select (them) and press “**Select this ACER Code**”.
- 57 Alternatively, it is possible to select one or more items by ticking the check box directly in the list. Please note that the list contains multiple pages and that it is possible to view more items by clicking on “Next” in the navigation bar (see [Figure 12](#)).

### 3.3.3. Description of the potential breach

59 This page is dedicated to the description of the potential REMIT breach. You are required to provide information regarding the type of product(s) involved, as well as the reasons for suspecting the events might constitute a REMIT breach.

60 Please note that, to fill in the product information, you need to select “Number of product(s) involved” and then click on the corresponding text fields labelled “**Product**” (see [Figure 14](#)).

 61 **TIP: Depending on the possible type of REMIT breach you identified in section Basic information, you might also be asked to fill in details regarding public disclosure of information. In this case, additional fields will become available to you.**

 62 **TIP: If the potential breach involves several timeframes, e.g. intraday and day-ahead, please select the number “2” for the field “Number of products”, even if the breach involves multiple hours/days. The time element can be indicated in the field “Period of infringement”. The concrete contracts can be listed in the field: “Contract ID”.**

- 63 Once you click on the relevant product number, additional fields will be displayed for you to input further product details (see [Figure 15](#)).
- 64 The field “Number of products involved” is editable once selected, i.e. even if you initially select 2 products, you can afterwards select 4 (or vice versa) without losing any of the information you have provided.



### 3.3.5. Submitting the notification and keeping records


Figure 17: Confirmation of submission and receipt

67 Once you have completed the form, have read ACER’s data protection privacy statement and agreed with the personal data processing activities related to the use of the NP, click “**Submit**” at the bottom right corner of your screen (see [Figure 16](#)). A pop-up window appears, asking you to confirm the submission of the notification to the chosen NRA and to ACER (see [Figure 17](#)). After your notification is sent, you will be able to download a PDF version of your submission by clicking on the “**Download Notification Document**” (see [Figure 17](#)).

## 4. How to Save and Resume a Notification

- 68 At any point in time, you can save your notification as a draft by clicking on the “**Save as draft**” button. The system will generate and display a link to your submission form where the information you have already provided will be stored (see [Figure 18](#)).

- 69 **Make sure you save the link to the submission form.** The links are unique and cannot be recovered. If you lose your link but still wish to submit your notification, you will have to re-fill the information you have submitted.

## 5. Work offline – available to PPAETs

70 This functionality is for now only available to PPAETs.

71 The functionality provides the option to work offline. The required information is gathered in a template, which can be uploaded once completed.

72 You can access this template at the following link:

73 The template is a protected Excel file, which is provided to the NRAs by the Agency. It aggregates all the information requested by the online tool, as detailed in the previous sections of this guide.

74 The template is an .xlsx document; the user must fill in the Excel sheet(s) according to the instructions provided in the template. After filling in the document, .xlsx document must be saved using the “Save as” functionality by choosing “Excel version: 97-2003” (.xls extension).

75 Once you have filled in the template, you will be able to upload it in the system by submitting an Article 15 of REMIT notification and selecting “Import through Excel template” as Type of Notification (see [Figure 19](#)).

76 **Uploading an altered template or a different Excel file will result in a failed import.** The tool only accepts information presented according to the template. For NP fields with drop-down value selection, your input must match the pre-set values. You can find individual instructions for each field under the “Description” column for each worksheet. For the list of accepted values in particular fields, refer to the “values” worksheet.

77 Once the file is uploaded to the system, a draft notification will be generated. The submission procedure from this point on will be the same as described in section [2.3.6 Submitting the notification and keeping records](#). This allows you to attach documents to your submission, as well as to verify that the information was transmitted accurately.

## 6. Other features

### 6.1. Legal Disclaimer and Cookie Disclaimer

#### 6.1.1. Legal disclaimer

- 78 In the lower part (footer) of every page of the Notification Platform, you can find a link named “**Legal disclaimer**” (see Figure 20). The link contains information with a disclaimer, a copyright notice and rules related to personal data protection and information transmission.

#### 6.1.2. Cookie disclaimer

- 79 The Notification Platform uses cookies in order to offer a better browsing experience. Once you log into the Notification Platform, you will see a warning notice (see Figure 21).

- 80 Clicking on “**I accept cookies**” will make this notice disappear. Clicking on the link “**how we use cookies and how you can change your settings**”, will redirect you to “**Cookie Disclaimer**”, a web page containing information on what cookies are, why they are used and how the Notification Platform uses them.

### 6.2. Important Notice on the “Reload” and “Back” Buttons

- 81 The HTTP protocol does not allow to use the “Reload” and “Back” button that browsers and keyboards provide without resubmitting the request or the information contained in the form; thus, using these buttons is not recommended. On the other hand, the “Back” buttons incorporated in the Notification Platform are designed to manage the command appropriately and are therefore the recommended way to go to a previous page.

## 7. Help and Support

### 7.1. Support Service Contacts

84 You can always access the user manual by clicking on the question mark icon  located on the right-hand side of your screen (see [Figure 22](#)). This will open a pop-up window containing detailed guidance on how to use the platform. By clicking on “here” within the pop-up, you will be able to download the PDF version of the user manual.

## 8. Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

### Q1. How can I ensure that I remain anonymous in my submission?

85 The field “I wish to remain anonymous” is only available for “Others” Suspicious Transaction and Order Report type of notifications. If you wish to remain anonymous, please select the option “Others” when choosing the type of notification you want to submit. The “Others” form is shown in [Figure 9](#).

86 In the Notifying Parties section, select “**Yes**” in the box corresponding to “**I wish to remain anonymous.**”

87 By doing so, you will not be prompted to provide any personal information. However, please ensure that you manually remove any personal data from your submission, including from all documents you choose to attach.

### Q2. Why can't I click the Submit button?

88 If you are unable to click the **Submit** button, it is likely that you have either not completed all mandatory fields on the form (marked with bold text and an asterisk \*, see [Figure 3](#)), or you have not confirmed that you have read the ACER’ Data Protection Privacy Statement and are aware of the personal data processing activities related to the use of the Notification Platform.

89 If you attempt to submit the notification without completing the required fields, a **warning message** will appear, prompting you to fill in the missing information. The incomplete fields will be highlighted in red and the message “**Field required**” will appear next to the field. Once all mandatory fields are completed, you will be able to proceed with the submission.

90 Also make sure to tick the following boxes:

- “I have read the Data Protection [Privacy statement](#) and I am aware of ACER’s personal data processing activities related to the use of the Notification Platform.”
- “By clicking submit the selected authority or authorities and ACER will be informed about this notification and the provided information in a secure and confidential manner.”

### Q3. How can I make sure that my submission was sent properly?

91 Once you have completed the form, read the **ACER’s data protection privacy statement, and agreed to the personal data processing activities** related to the use of the Notification Platform, click “Submit” at the bottom right corner of your screen (see [Figure 16](#)).

92 A pop-up window will appear asking you to confirm the submission of your notification to the selected NRA and to ACER (see [Figure 17](#)).

93 After the notification has been successfully sent, you will see the option to **download a PDF version** of your submission by clicking on “**Download Notification Document**” (see [Figure 17](#)). If this download option appears, it confirms that your notification has been submitted correctly.

## Q4. How can I save or print a copy of my submission?

- 94 After you have successfully submitted your notification, a “**Download Notification Document**” button will appear on the screen (see [Figure 17](#)).
- 95 By clicking this button, you can download a PDF version of your submission. Once downloaded, you can save it for your records or print it if needed.
- 96 This document serves as proof that your notification has been sent.

## Q5. Can I edit my submission after it has been sent?

- 97 You cannot edit your submission once it has been sent.
- 98 However, at any point before submission, you can save your notification as a draft by clicking the “Save as draft” button, as it’s described in the section [How to Save and Resume a Notification](#). The system will then generate and display a unique link to your draft submission form, where all previously entered information is stored (see [Figure 18](#)).
- 99 Please make sure to save this link securely, as it cannot be recovered later. If you lose the link and still wish to submit your notification, you will need to start a new submission and re-enter all information.
